




Recommended Pub for imbibing between collection rummaging and pasta eating is <u>The Anchor</u>, which is on the river and a 10-minute walk to the restaurant

How to find University Museum of Zoology

The Museum is located on the New Museums Site, right in the heart of Cambridge City Centre. Enter the site through the Pembroke Arch on Downing Street. Entrance to the Museum is via the Whale Hall, which has a step free access.

By train: Cambridge Station is a 20 minute, or 1.1 mile walk from the museum. Trains run frequently to London Kings Cross (55-minute journey time) and to other destinations. Taxis and buses run frequently from the station to the city centre.
